The Nampa Police department is pleased to announce its participation in the Alive at 25 defensive driving program. Nampa Police, in cooperation with the Idaho Transportation Department and National Safety Council, is teaching classes for the Alive at 25 program. The class is geared for young drivers that are 15-24 years of age. The 4 ½ hour course is in a classroom setting, there is no behind the wheel driving. Only certified law enforcement officers teach this course. Each class is free, and promotes responsibility and commitment to safe driving practices.

Alive at 25 is a highly interactive, young driver, intervention program. The instructor uses workbook exercises, interactive video segments, small group discussions, role-playing, and short lectures, to help young drivers develop strategies and convictions that will keep them safer on the road. The student is able to identify the leading causes of crashes involving drivers of this age group, and then decide the appropriate safe driving practices to avoid them.

With crashes being the leading cause of death to the 15-24 year old age group, the Nampa Police Department encourages young drivers to attend the Alive at 25 program. A Colorado study showed that students who graduated from the Alive at 25 program were nearly 75% less likely to die in an automobile class before their 25th birthday when compared to national statistics.
